**Register by Friday, January 27.** Registration is coordinated by District 196 Community Education. Registration for an after school class can be done two ways:

**1. Register online at [www.district196.org/ce](http://www.district196.org/ce)** and click on the "Navigation Menu" tab located on the upper left side of the main page. Then click on "Registration" and then on "Browse and Register Online". First time users will need to set up an account and add all family members who will be registering for the after school classes. To search for an after school class online, type in the course code or name.

When registering, please check to make sure class location is Diamond Path Elementary. Students who enroll online receive a class confirmation email and will also receive a class confirmation sent home from school. Registering online is your best chance to get into your class of choice.

**2. Return registration form with payment to your child's classroom teacher by Friday, January 27.**

Students should register for a first choice and a second choice. Class sizes are limited. Submission of a registration does not guarantee placement in a class. Every effort will be made to place your child in an after school class of their choice. If your child is not placed in any after school class, you will be notified by phone. Class confirmations will be sent home from school.

**PLEASE READ NEW SCHOLARSHIP POLICY.** Scholarships are available. One scholarship per student, per session is available to students on free and reduced lunch. Students on reduced lunch receive a 50% discount on one class fee in this brochure. **Students on free lunch pay \$15 for one class in this brochure.** If student would like to register for second class, the class fee for the second class must be paid in full.

Scholarships cannot be accepted through the online registration process. If you wish to request a scholarship for an after school class, please fill out the appropriate information on the registration form and turn in to your child's classroom teacher or call the Community Education registrars at 651-423-7920.

**Regular attendance is expected.** Please send a note if your child attends during the school day, but is excused from his/her after school class. Students on scholarship who miss more than two days of class will not be eligible for a scholarship for the next after school session.

**Classes may be canceled due to bad weather or emergencies.** Visit [www.district196.org/ce](http://www.district196.org/ce), District 196 Community Ed on Facebook, listen to the media, or call Community Education at 651-423-7920. If District 196 schools are closed for the day, after school community education activities are canceled. Every effort will be made to reschedule canceled classes however, there are instances where classes cannot be rescheduled.

**A school nurse may not always be on-site during the Community Education enrichment classes that take place before or after the school day.** Emergency medications will be given directly to the Community Education program coordinator. Emergency medications will be administered by a trained school personnel when the school nurse is unavailable.

**No bus transportation is available.** Students may walk home if they are within the walker boundaries, or they must be picked up by a parent or guardian. Crossing guards will not be provided for students who walk. To pick up your child, meet your child at the main entrance. Please be prompt.
