

To write to a CD using Toast on a Macintosh computer with external CD writer

CD-Rs can be used with all models of Macintosh computers. CD-RW can only be used with G3 or G4 Macintosh computers. Do not copy more than 600M of files/folders per CD. You may bypass simulation mode steps if you are sure the setup will work or you don't mind wasting a blank CD if it doesn't work.

Open Macintosh HD/Utilities/Toast3.5.6/Toast 3.5.6.
Select **Format** then **Mac Files and Folders**.

The name of the CD Recorder should be listed under CD Recorder, otherwise click **Search**.

Click **Data**.

Click **New CD**.

Double-click "Untitled" and give the CD a name and click **OK**.

Click **Add...**

Browse to the file or folder you want to copy and click **Add**.

Repeat until all desired files and folders are added.

Click **Done**.

Click **Done** again.

Click **Check Speed...**

If the speed check fails, lower the speed from 4X to 2X or 1X and try speed check again.

If speed check doesn't fail then click **Done**.

Click **Write CD...**

Check **Simulation Mode**.

Click **Write Disc**.

Click **Eject** when done.

If simulation runs OK then reinsert CD and click **Write CD**.

Uncheck **Simulation Mode** and click **Write Disc**.

Click **Eject** when done.
