1. Approval of Minutes – the October minutes were approved.
2. Student Council Minutes
  - The School Store opened on Monday. It will be open on Mondays and Wednesdays before school.
  - Student Council set their goals for the year:
    1. Assist in making a safe and healthy environment for learning.
    2. Help students want to learn in a fun way.
    3. Make a positive difference in the world.
  - Student Council had a video conference with the Student Council at Ivy Bridge School in England. They will conference with Ivy Bridge Student Council each month to share ideas and events happening at each school.
3. Review Agenda/Additions – Recycling was added to the agenda. It was explained that recycling is directed by the district office. Elementary schools have two categories: trash and compost. The trash consists of mostly paper items and the compost is from food waste. The trash is separated at the waste management site for recycling. Due to this process, a recycling bin in each classroom is no longer necessary.

5. Parent Leader Superintendent Report
  - There will be no Parent Mtg. in December.
  - 6,800 responded to the district survey. Following are some results:
    - Mr. Currie presented before the School Board to propose a change of start times for district schools. In approximately two weeks the Board will vote and announce a decision. The *proposed* student contact time for DP students is 8:50 AM to 3:10 PM.
    - A proposal for year round school is not currently being considered.
    - A world language for each elementary school will not be pursued at this time. Due to current national economic conditions, the \$2 million investment is too risky.
    - The district calendar committee will review the schedule for next year. The survey indicated families, staff and students would prefer not to have a week off over MEA and Conference.

- The district is currently reviewing the process of students leaving school/coming back to school when they have or had lice. More information will follow after a review is conducted.
6. Principal's Report-Proposed start times for next year. See handout. No decision will be made on staff hours until a decision has been made by the School Board to change the start times for students.
