Please Note: Times and sessions may change due to the number of registrations and staff availability.

The 2009 summer school program provides Rosemount High School students the opportunity to earn credits toward graduation. Courses offered are for makeup credit only. Additional courses will provide students with the opportunity to study required MCA GRAD examinations. Courses are available at no charge to students who attend Rosemount High School or live in the RHS attendance area. Students may earn up to four credits during summer school. Summer school will be divided into two sessions.

Summer Session I will meet all weekdays June 15 through July 1. Summer Session II will meet all weekdays July 6 through July 22. Period 1 will meet from 7:30 - 10:15 a.m. Period 2 will meet from 10:20 a.m. - 1:05 p.m.

- All students attending will be responsible for providing their own transportation to and from Rosemount High School Summer School.
- Attendance is mandatory for all classes. Students are expected to be on-time for class every day.
- Students will register on the enclosed forms and return them to the School Counseling Department at Rosemount High School on or before May 22, 2009. Students must have approval of a guidance counselor to enroll in all classes.
- Classes may be cancelled due to a lack of enrollment or staff availability.
- The campus is closed between classes.
- All regular school rules are in effect during summer school.
