# 2004-2005 Film, Video and Animation Festival

**Matt Abramson (w/Andy Colburn & Josh Mundahl)** – *Theater Introduction* (3d Animation). This 3D version of a movie theater forms the introduction to the festival. (1:00)

**Nathan Henry** – *Destruction of the Rainforest* (Public Service Announcement). This PSA is intended to raise awareness about the alarming rate at which the world's rainforests are disappearing due to deforestation. (1:00)

**Scott Menk** – *Lightning Basketball Highlights* (Highlight Tape). This is the final section of a 32 minute highlight video encapsulating the boys' basketball team's run at state. (3:08)

**Jason Meinke** – *Lizard Attack* (3d Animation). This animation, reminiscent of King Kong, was modeled and animated using 3D studio viz. (2:34)

**Katie Wilharm & Vivien Stender** - *Minnesota Swarm Journalism Contest* (News Story). This piece highlights an event where high school journalists covered a lacrosse game. (3:00)

**Andrew Cotterman** – *Invincible* (Music Video). This music video utilizes 3d studio viz and adobe premiere to create a surrealistic scene. (2:00)

**Carter Stanton** – *Clocks* (Short Film). This short feature provides a glimpse into the world around us. (5:30)

**Jeremy Budd** – *The Average Military Man* (Video Poetry). This video is based on a poem about our military heroes. (3:30)

**Students in The Flash** – *Around the Horn* (News Magazine Show). This student broadcast is a parody of the ESPN show of the same name.

**McKenna Ewen** - *The Game of Life* (Short Film). This one minute segment shows that life isn't always as simple as it seems. (1:00)

**Alex Voshell, Kyle Starkson, Alex Stevens, & Kris Marinello** – *Amadeus 2* (Music Video). This sequel continues the humorous travels of our favorite classical musician and his friends.

**Michael Lindsay** - *Tsunami Walk-A-Thon* (News Story). This longer news segment highlights Eastview's fundraiser for the tsunami survivors. (4:10)

**Mitch Dreier, Stu Boyston, & Erinn North** – *Conflicting Chaos* (Experimental Film). This short feature shows the impact of chance on one's life. All of the video and audio in this film is original. (6:30)

**William Miekjohn, Frank Cacich, Katie Wilharm & Natalie Jones** – *Bananaphone* (Humor). This humorous segment makes a music video from a children's song. (1:22)

**Justin Olson** – *The Zaku II* (3d Animation). This 3D character was created and animated using 3d Studio Viz.

**Tom Her & Kyle Starkson** – *Grand Theft Audio* (Public Service Announcement). This PSA describes how music piracy is a growing problem. (1:00)

**Danielle Rud, Brock Melander & Jon Friedman** – *Robot Rumble* (Stop-Frame Animation). This claymation segment shows a dance contest between two extremely flexible characters. (3:20)

**Students in The 4Cast** – *Anchorman Show* (Daily Announcements Show). This student-produced episode is a parody of the Will Ferrel comedy. (6:10)

**Adam Nelson, Mari Boe, Justin Dahlke, William Meiklejohn, Michael Lindsay & Rebecca Habegger** – *Appearances* (Short Film). This movie was shot, edited, and streamed to the Internet in 24 hours as part of a national contest called "The Red Eye Film Festival"

**Becca Habegger** – *Speech Highlights* (Highlight Tape). This is a short segment from the video highlighting the speech team's season. (2:30)

**Kane Bechstein, William Meiklejohn, Mitch Dreier, & McKenna Ewen** – *The Easy Button* (Humor). This credits segment is a spin-off of the Staples commercial. (1:15)
