Scholarships are available for students on free and reduced lunch. Students on reduced lunch receive a 50% discount on class fees. Students on free lunch receive a full scholarship.

Card Making Club (grades 3-5)

Cartooning (grades 4-5)

Learn to draw your very own awesome cartoon characters like a pro. Watch many cartoons, create characters and discover the rich history of cartoons. Explore famous cartoonists and animators including Walt Disney, Chuck Jones and Charles Schulz. Bring a friend and join the fun! Fee includes supplies. Cold Blooded Adventure (grades 2-3)

Become a student doctor as you learn about the human body and basic first aid through plenty of hands-on activities. Create a life-size model as you explore the circulatory, skeletal and digestive

systems. Participate in mock emergency situations, create a basic first aid kit and more when you join us in the emergency room. *Science Explorers*

Showtime! The Stinky Cheese Man (grades 3-5)

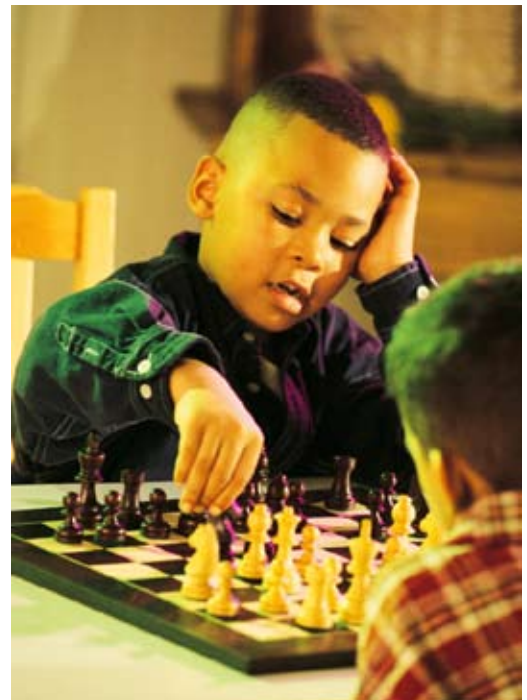
