## Factors Considered

## Family Survey Input

- Results
- 6,446 submissions
- 4,995 in hybrid ( $77 \%$ )
- 1,110 in 196 Digital Academy (17\%)

■ 341 in multiple learning models (5\%)

- HYBRID Family Responses
- $65 \%(3,247)$ in hybrid learning model want to increase to four days of in-person learning
- 35\% $(1,748)$ in hybrid learning model want to stay in hybrid
- 196 DIGITAL ACADEMY Family Responses
- 72\% (799) in 196 Digital Academy want to stay in hybrid with two days of synchronous learning
- $28 \%$ (311) in 196 Digital Academy want to increase synchronous learning from two to four days


## Factors Considered

## Vaccinations and Testing for Staff

- Educators prioritized for vaccinations; offered to all staff by early March
- Onsite testing for staff every other week
- Thank you, Dakota County Public Health and Minnesota Department of Health



## Factors Considered COVID-19 Data

- 14-day county case rates (\# cases per 10,000 residents)
- Increased last several weeks (25.8 to 27.24 to 32.19 )
- April 8: 40.29 cases per 10,000 (two weeks ending March 27)
- This week: Projecting 51.5
- Positivity rate: MN- 5.4\%; Dakota County- 6.9\%
- No school outbreaks or identified spread within classrooms, to date

## Factors Considered

## Mitigation Strategies: <br> Distancing \& Quarantines

- 6 feet to 3 feet of social distancing ( 6 feet close contact still applies)
- More quarantines with reduced distancing


Hybrid at secondary (current)


Four days in-person at secondary

## Factors Considered

## Mitigation Strategies

- Change classroom layout, where possible, to reduce quarantines
- Specific mitigation strategies for music instructional spaces



## Factors Considered

## Mitigation Strategies

- Staff vaccinated
- Onsite testing for staff
- PPE - masks and shields
- HEPA air purifiers in all classrooms
- Hand sanitizer stations
- Plexiglass barriers
- Social distancing visuals
- School-performed contact tracing

- Pro-active notification of positive cases in community


## Factors Considered

## Community Responsibilities

- Self-identify and stay home if sick
- Get tested - encouraging staff, students and families to get tested weekly
- Get vaccinated
- Use caution when socializing and participating in activities and sports (main cause of spread)
- Follow quarantine and isolation protocols
- Partner with district and school COVID-19 teams



## Secondary Learning Model

## Four-Day, In-Person Schedule

- Four days in person - Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday
- Wednesdays are distance learning
- Student support opportunities (interventions and enrichment)
- Additional state-required planning time for teachers providing instruction to students both in person and online simultaneously
- Staff collaboration and alignment between in-person and distance learning curriculum
- More synchronous learning opportunities for 196 Digital Academy students; asynchronous learning opportunities will continue, with flexibility for families
